### Big ideas

 The Aboriginal people lived on the land for thousands of years before James Cook arrived in 1770 at Botany Bay. What happened when Cook first met the Aboriginal people at Kurnell?

#### Overview

These activities will explore some aspects of life for the Aboriginal people before the arrival of James Cook in 1770 and the perspectives of the people involved.

#### **Activities**

- 1. **Explore** the <u>360 Virtual Reality Kamay</u> tour. There are 12 sites. Use your mouse to look around the 360 view. Click on the arrow to move to the next site.
  - a. List 3 plants that were used by the Aboriginal people. What were they used for?
  - b. List 3 types of food that the Aboriginal people gathered from or near the bay
- Perspectives. What do you think the Aboriginal people would have been thinking or feeling when they saw this strange ship arrive in Botany Bay?


