Stage 2: The Earth's Environment Kamay Botany Bay National Park

Students will investigate the natural characteristics of Australian vegetation and native animals at Kamay Botany Bay National Park. Students will observe first hand the unique features of the dry eucalypt forest and sandy beaches of the Kurnell Peninsular.

During the excursion students will study how areas are managed to protect the natural features whilst keeping visitors safe. Students will use a variety of fieldwork tools to record their evidence, observations and investigations.

Students will take part in activities that encourage them to understand the importance of why National Parks are valued and why it is important to protect and manage them sustainably.


